Messers: H.W. Vorbeck, Ole Nelson, and Chas. Rump a committee from the Chamber of Commerce appeared before the Council relative to band concerts for the summer. The matter was taken under consideration.

The bids for scales were opened. It was moved by Commissioner Garber, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies purchase one 15 ton Type "P" Fairbanks scale at \$1044.75 F.O.B. Grand Jet. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows, Cherrington, yea; Garber, Yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Peck, yea. All the Commissioners voting yea the motion was declared carried and the purchase authorized.

A petition was presented requesting an extension of the water main on Belford and Twelfth Street. It was suggested that the matter be turned over to Commissioner Garber for investigation and a report to be made by him at the next meeting.

Bids for the painting of the Lincoln Park were read. Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, second by Commissioner Garber that the contract be awarded to George Carlson at a price of \$175.00. The motion being put upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows, Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Peck yea. All the commissioners voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

The report of the City Weigher for the month of April was read. Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, second by Commissioner Garber that the report be accepted and filed as read. Motion carried.

A communication from the State Public Utilities Commission was referred to City Attorney Tupper for his recommendation.

There being no further business to bring before the council Commissioner Blackstone moved, second by Commissioner Garber that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
