

May 24, 1921

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo., was called to order at 3:30 P.M. with Mayor Cherrington presiding. The Commissioners present were, Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, and Peck. City Attorney Tupper was present. Mr. Baker of the Daily Sentinel was also present.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

Mr. Baker came before the council requesting the city to purchase Five hundred copies of the Daily Sentinel's opportunity number. This matter was postponed until the next regular meeting.

Moved by Commissioner Peck, second by Commissioner Garber that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase One Hundred 4 x 6 flags for street decoration. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Peck, Yea. All the Commissioners voting yea, the motion was declared carried and the purchase authorized.

Moved by Commissioner Peck, second by Commissioner Garber that A.D. Smith be given the contract for the construction of three comfort stations at Lincoln Park. The cost to be \$1135.20. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Peck, yea. All the Commissioners voting yea the motion was declared carried.
