All the Commissioners having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo. met in special session with Mayor Cherrington presiding, the meeting having been called to order at 5:00 P.M. The Commissioners present were Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, and Peck. City Attorney Tupper was present.

A committee from the Chamber of Commerce consisting of Wm. Buthorne, S.E. Winterburn and D.T. Stone appeared before the Council to state that the Chamber of Commerce were negotiating with Fred F. Grover of Pueblo Colo. with the view of getting him to build a meat packing plant on parts of Blocks 3, 6, and 11, Cannons Addition to the City of Grand Junction; that on condition of his coming that he be furnished a location for his plant, sewer connections and connections with the water mains. The committee asked that the City do the work of digging the trench and installing the sewer pipe, the pipe and all materials to be furnished by the Chamber of Commerce on the ground, and also that the City lay the water pipe to the ground.

It was moved by Commissioner Peck, second by Commissioner Garber that the City do the necessary work of digging and installing the sewer and also digging the trench and installing the water pipe, all material to be furnished by the Chamber of Commerce or others. The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Peck, yea. All the Commissioners voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

Upon motion of Commissioner Peck, second by Commissioner Garber the meeting was adjourned.
