

Grand Junction, Colo.
August 10, 1921.

The Commissioners having been duly notified a special meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction was called to order at 4:00 o'clock P.M. with Mayor Cherrington presiding. The Commissioners present were Cherrington, Garber, Blackstone and Peck. City Attorney Tupper was present.

The Mayor stated that the purpose of the meeting was to appoint a Commissioner of Finance and Supplies to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of J.F. Whittaker.

The resignation of Fred A. Peck as Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was presented and read. Moved by Commissioner Garber, second by Commissioner Blackstone that the resignation be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

The application of Fred A Peck for the position of Commissioner of Finance and Supplies was presented and read. The official bond accompanying the office was also presented. Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, second by Commissioner Garber that the application and bond be accepted and filed and that Fred A Peck be appointed Commissioner of Finance and Supplies until the expiration of the term. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Blackstone yea. All the Commissioners voting yea, the motion was declared carried, and the appointment confirmed.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, second by Commissioner Garber that the City Treasurer act as City Clerk pending the filling of the vacancy left by Fred A. Peck. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Blackstone, yea; Peck, yea. All the Commissioners voting yea the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Garber, second by Commissioner Blackstone that the Commissioner of Highways take over the work of over seeing the parks and that the Mayor take charge of the work of the health department. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Blackstone, yea; Peck, yea. All the Commissioners voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

Upon motion of Commissioner Peck, second by Commissioner Garber, the meeting adjourned.
