Grand Junction, Colo. September 6, 1921

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened at 4:00 o'clock P.M. with Mayor Cherrington presiding. The Commissioners present were Cherrington, Garber, peck and Blackstone. City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

Mr. A.E. Anderson of the Grand Junction Elec. Gas and Electric Co. was present on the request of the Council to explain the cause of the poor gas now being manufactured and sold by the company. Mr. Anderson informed the council that the reason for the poor gas was due to the small capacity of the plant. He also informed the Council that plans were under way to increase the capacity of the plant from 104,000 cubic feet to 160,000 cubic feet. This work to be finished by the spring of 1922.

The following resolution was read by the clerk.

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS many complaint have come to the City Council that service being rendered to the public in Grand Junction by the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company is inefficient and slow

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a hearing be, and the same is hereby set to investigate the said claims of inefficiency and poor service, together with a remedy therefor; and the said hearing to be held at the City Hall in Grand Junction, Colorado on September 1921 at 9:00 A.M.; that the Mayor be and he is hereby required to notify the said Company of said hearing.

Moved by Commissioner Peck, second by Commissioner Garber that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Peck, yea; Blackstone, yea. All the Commissioner voting yea, the motion was declared carried.
