

Grand Junction, Colo.
October 4, 1921

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened at 4:00 o'clock P.M. with Mayor Cherrington presiding. The commissioners present were Cherrington, Garber, Blackstone and Peck. City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

Captain Ragsdale of the Salvation Army was present requesting the Council to donate \$150.00 to help establish a wood yard on condition that the county do likewise. Said yard to take care of transient men looking for work.

Moved by Commissioner Garber, second by Commissioner Blackstone a Treasurers warrant be drawn for the amount. The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows, Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Peck, yea; Blackstone yea. All the Commissioners voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Cherrington, seconded by Commissioner Peck, that the Acting City Clerk demand the 10 per cent due the City on gate receipts collected at Lincoln Park during the County Fair, together with a statement of receipts for said week. Motion carried.

The following resolution was presented and read.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that A.J. Peck be and the same is hereby employed to act as assistant or deputy City Clerk to assist in said registration and he is hereby authorized to administer the necessary oaths as required by the registration ordinances of the City of Grand Junction.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, second by Commissioner Garber that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows, Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Peck, yea; Blackstone yea. All the Commissioners voting yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution adopted.

The report of the City Weigher for the Month of September was read. Moved by Commissioner Peck, second by Commissioner Garber that the report be accepted and placed on file. Motion carried.
