

Grand Junction, Colo.
October 18, 1921.

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, convened at 4:00 O'clock P.M. with Mayor Cherrington presiding. The Commissioners present were Cherrington, Garber, Blackstone and Peck. City Attorney Tupper was present. The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

A petition requesting certain are lights installed on the West Side was presented and read. Blackstone moved, seconded by Commissioner Garber that the petition be accepted and filed and referred to the Mayor for investigation. Motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Peck, second by Commissioner Blackstone that the stalls at Lincoln Park be rented for the sum of \$1.00 per stall a month. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows, Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Peck, yea, Blackstone, yea. All the Commissioners voting, yea, the motion was declared carried.

A report from Dr. Munroe, City Health Officer stated that the sample of City water tested by him was free from any harmful germs and substances whatsoever.
