Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Fonder that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized to buy \$10,000.00 more or less of 6% Water Bonds due April 1st. 1923. These bonds to be bought at 101 and 1-2 and interest.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows, Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea, Blackstone, yea, Peck, yea, Fonder, yea. All the Commissioners voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

The proposed annual appropriation ordinance for the year 1922 was read. Moved by Commissioner Peck, seconded by Commissioner Garber

that the ordinance as read be approved and passed for publication. Motion carried.

The third quarterly report of the City Treasurer was read. Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Peck that the report be referred to the City Clerk for Audit. Motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Cherrington, seconded by Commissioner Peck that the bill for \$140.67 for two lamp posts including freight paid be allowed to the Western Slope Auto Company, said amount to be paid from the special light fund, and the Elks Lodge be billed for one half of the amount. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows, Cherrington yea, Garber, yea, Peck, yea; Blackstone, yea All the Commissioners voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

John B. Fonder, newly elected Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty took the oath of office and assumed the duties of his office.
