

Grand Junction, Colorado, Jan. 2, 1922

The City Commissioners of the City of Grand Junction met in adjourned session at 8:00 o'clock A.M., Mayor Cherrington presiding.

On Roll Call those present were – Cherrington, Blackstone, Peck, Garber, and Fender. City Attorney was also present.

County Commissioner Gus Johnson and County Attorney Heckman were present Representing the county regarding the exchange of property between the city and the county.

A resolution was read as follows:

Whereas Peoples Ordinance No. 9 authorized the exchange of Block 84 in the city of Grand Junction owned by the city of Grand Junction and County of Mesa for Block 95 in said city owned by School District No. One, subject to certain reservations and conditions as set out in said ordinance; And whereas the County of Mesa desires to consummate the said exchange at once. Therefore, be it resolved that a deed be delivered to the said School District No. One, conveying the north half of said Block 84 subject to the reservations as set out in said ordinance; the said School District to deliver a deed to the City of Grand Junction conveying the west half of Block 95 subject to certain reservations as set out in the said Peoples Ordinance and to be further resolved that a warrant for the sum of \$2,875.00 be executed and delivered to said School District No. 1 sum being the amount required by said Ordinance to be paid by the said city to the said School District. And be it further resolved that Warrant No. 33532 be cancelled.

It was moved by Fender, sand seconded by Garber that resolution be adopted. On Roll Call the commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, Aye; Garber, Aye; Peck, Aye; Fender, Aye; Blackstone, Aye.

All Commissioners voting Aye, resolution was adopted.

Report of Fire Chief Haynes was received and on motion referred to the Auditor.

Report of Fire Chief Hynes on scales and water read and referred to the auditor.

Report of Cherrington as Judge of the Municipal Court for the fourth quarter on fines and costs was made and on motion referred to the auditor.

Report of Commissioner of Public Affairs for the year was read and on motion referred to the auditor.
