MINUTES March 8, 1922

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo., met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Hirons presiding. The Councilmen present were Hirons, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr. Councilmen Marshall and Meders were absent. City Manager Garrett, City Clerk Peck, City attorney Jordan and City Treasurer Bunting were present.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

Applications for the position of City Treasurer were read. The same were carried over to the next regular meeting.

A communication from the Chamber of Commerce requesting the remittance of the 10% of the gate receipts at the County Fair in September was read. The communication was accepted and ordered filed for future reference, or until the matter can be more thoroughly considered.

An application from John Sullivan requesting a permit to establish an employment agency in the city was referred to the City Manager.

Council Murr stated that old buildings at the Corner of Third and Main used as lunch cars were eyesores to the city and steps should be taken to remove them. The old wooden building on the North side of Colorado Ave. between 4th and 5th was also declared unsightly and a grave fire menace.

It was then moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the City Attorney investigate the procedure of the removal of said buildings, and report to City Council. Motion carried.

Moved by Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilman Murr, that the City Manager use his discretion in the matter of the purchase of street signs for the City. Motion carried.

Mr. Garrett brought up the matter of the purchase of a power pump for the Water Department. Moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that City Manager Garrett use his discretion regarding such purchase. Motion carried. On motion of Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Council Hampson the Council adjourned.
