

MINUTES
April 26, 1922

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Hiron presiding. The Councilmen present were Hiron, Marshall, Meders, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr. Councilman Miller was absent. City Manager Garrett, City Attorney Jordan and City Clerk Peck were present.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved

A comparative report for the expenditures of the years 1921 and 1922 was presented by the City Manager. The report was accepted and ordered filed.

A petition asking that an improvement district be formed in Dundee Place for sidewalk and curb was presented and read.

It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Meders, that the petition be accepted and filed on the condition that the City would not be required to grade the streets in said district at the present time. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows: Hiron, yea; Marshall, nay; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, yea; Murr, yea. The majority of the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

The following resolution was introduced and read.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on January 1st, 1922, there remains in the Library Fund over and above the expenditures of 1921, the sum of \$549.81, and

WHEREAS, it is desired to transfer said money to the general Fund of the City,

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the said fund is hereby transferred to the general Fund of the City and the City Auditor and City Treasurer are hereby authorized and instructed to make the necessary transfer on their books.

Moved by Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Marshall, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows: Hirons, yea; Marshall, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, yea; Murr, yea. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

Mr. Buthorne was present requesting that action be taken on the ordinance changing the fire limits. It was then moved by Councilman Dowrey seconded by Councilman Murr, that the emergency ordinance entitled "An emergency ordinance amending Section 1 of Ordinance 301 passed and adopted the 26th day of July, 1921, and entitled "A building ordinance and also concerning the storage and handling of gasoline", be rejected. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows: Hirons, yea; Marshall, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, yea; Murr, yea. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

An ordinance entitled "An ordinance amending section 1 of Ordinance No. 301, passed and adopted on the 26th day of July A.D. 1921, and entitled, "A building ordinance and also concerning the storage and handling of gasoline" was then presented and read.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Meders, that the ordinance as read and entitled "An ordinance amending Section 1, of Ordinance 301, passed and adopted the 26th day of July, 1921, and entitled "A building ordinance and also concerning the handling and storage of gasoline" be passed for publication. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows: Hirons, nay; Marshall, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, yea; Murr, yea. The majority of the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

A delegation headed by B.C. Fox and Mark Bunting appeared before the Council asking for information as to when the paving program on Main Street would be commenced. The gentlemen were informed by the City Manager that as soon as the maps on the contemplated storm sewer system and the water system could be completed that paving of this street would be taken up.

Mr. Tony Flucken appeared before the Council asking that certain reductions be given him on the tax certificates held by the City on Lot 9, Block 10, Mobley's Subdivision. The City Attorney was asked to prepare a resolution covering the sale of these certificates and to present the same at the next meeting.

The proposed ordinance entitled, "An ordinance concerning the sale, handling, and delivery of milk and inspection and regulation of dairies, and repealing ordinance No. 177, passed and adopted March 15, 1910, and each and every other ordinance and parts thereof in conflict herewith" was presented and read by the Clerk

It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Meders that the ordinance as read be passed for publication. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows, Hirons, yea; Marshall, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, yea; Murr, yea. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

A proposed ordinance entitled "An ordinance amending Section 1 of Ordinance No. 251, passed and adopted June 30th, 1916, and entitled 'An ordinance concerning sprinkling hours'" was read by the Clerk.

It was moved by Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Marshall, that the ordinance as read be passed for publication. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows: Hirons, yea; Marshall, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, nay, Murr, yea. The majority of the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Marshall, that the City Manager get in touch with a company of hydraulic engineers in regard to the improvement of the water system. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting was adjourned.
