

MINUTES
May 10th, 1922

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 P.M. In the absence of President Hirons, Councilman Murr presided over the meeting. The Councilmen present were Marshall, Miller, Dowrey, Meders, Hampson and Murr. President Hirons was absent. City Manager Garrett, City Attorney Jordan and City Clerk Peck were present.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and of the special meeting held April 29th were read and approved.

A petition signed by Mrs. Geo. Fletcher and others requesting a cement crosswalk on Ninth and Colorado Ave. was presented and read. Moved by Councilman Marshall, seconded by Councilman Miller, that the matter be referred to City Manager Garrett. Motion carried.

Bob Patterson appeared before the meeting complaining of the action of boys playing in the street on the West Side. It was moved by Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Marshall, that the City Manager investigate the situation and take steps to stop rowdyism in the City as a whole as well as on the West Side. Motion carried.

The proof of publication of the proposed ordinance entitled "An ordinance amending Section 1 of Ordinance No. 301, passed and adopted the 26th day of July, 1921, and entitled 'A building ordinance and also concerning the storage and handling of gasoline'" was read by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Dowrey, that the proof of publication be accepted and placed on file. Motion carried.

The proposed ordinance entitled "An ordinance amending Section 1 of Ordinance No. 301, passed and adopted the 26th day of July, 1921, and entitled 'A building ordinance and also concerning the handling of gasoline'" was read by the Clerk.

It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Dowrey, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed and adopted, numbered 316, and ordered published. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows: Marshall, yea; Miller, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson,

yea; Murr, yea. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried, and the ordinance adopted.

The proof of publication of the proposed ordinance entitled, "An ordinance amending Section 1 of ordinance Np. 251, passed and adopted June 30th, 1916 and entitled 'An ordinance concerning sprinkling hours'" was read. It was moved by Councilman Marshall, seconded by Councilman Dowrey, that the proof be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

The proposed ordinance entitled "An ordinance amending Section 1 of ordinance No. 251, passed and adopted June 30th, 1916, and entitled 'An ordinance concerning sprinkling hours'" was then read by the clerk.

It was moved by Councilman Marshall, seconded by Councilman Dowrey, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed and adopted, numbered 317 and ordered published. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows: Marshall, yea; Miller, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, yea; Murr, yea. All the Councilmen present voting yea; the motion was declared carried and the ordinance adopted.

The following resolution was presented and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Junction is the owner of Tax Certificates No. 18430 for water main tax; Tax certificates No. 18812 for sidewalk tax in Sidewalk District No. 1; and tax certificate Np. 22752 for sewer tax in Sewer District Np. 5, all covering Lot 9 in Block 10 of Mobley's Addition to the City of Grand Junction, and

WHEREAS, T.F. Flucken has offered to purchase said Tax Certificates for the face value thereof less 25%, together with interest thereon at the rate of 6% per annum from the date of said certificates.

THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction: That it will sell said tax certificates to the said T.F. Flucken for the face value thereof less 25%, together with interest thereon at the rate of 6% per annum from the dates of said certificates.

It was moved by Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Dowrey, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows; Marshall, yea; Miller, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, yea; Murr, yea. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

Proposals from the engineering firms of Burns and McDonnell, Stephens and Koon, and from the Weiland Engineering Company were received and read. Said proposals were relative to the improving of the water system and for the construction of a storm sewer system. Mr. McDonnell appeared in person and informed the Council of the nature of the work and explained the different phases of the proposed survey.

It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Meders, that the Council take the different proposals under consideration until the next meeting of the Council. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting was adjourned until May 12, 1922 at 7:30 P.M.
