

Grand Junction, Colorado
August 23, 1922

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular adjourned session at 8:00 O'clock P.M. with President Hirons presiding. The Councilmen present were Hirons, Meders, Marshall, Dowrey, and Hampson. Councilmen Murr and Miller were absent.

City Manager Garrett, City Attorney Jordan and City Clerk Peck were present.

The proof of publication of the proposed ordinance entitled "An ordinance providing for an emergency appropriation for the maintenance of the water system" was read. It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Meders that the proof be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

It was then moved by Councilman Dowrey seconded by Councilman Meders that the proposed ordinance be brot up for final passage. The motion being carried the proposed ordinance was read by the Clerk.

Moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Meders that the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE WATER SYSTEM" be passed and adopted and numbered 323. The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Councilmen present voted as follows, Hirons, yea; Marshall, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, yea; All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Meders that the report of the Engineering firm of Burns and McDonnell on the improvement of the water system be accepted and filed. The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Councilmen present voted as follows, Hirons, yea; Marshall, yea; Dowrey, yea, Meders, yea, Hampson, yea. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that the Chamber of Commerce be granted exclusive consessions on all shows, dances, stands ect in the City of Grand Junction, Moyer Pool refreshment room excepted, during the four days of the Fair, Sept. 6; 7, 8, and 9th. The motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Marshall that the City Auditor be authorized to notify the bonding houses that the Council would accept sealed bids on \$35,000.00 of bonds of Paving Dist. #6 on Sept. 6 1922 at 7:30 o'clock P.M. The Council to reserve the right to reject any or all bids. Motion carried.

Upon motion of Councilman Dowrey seconded by Councilman Meders, the Council was adjourned upon call of the President.
