

Grand Junction, Colorado  
September 15, 1922

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 P.M. with President Hirons presiding. The Councilmen present were, Hirons, Marshall, Miller, Meders, Dowrey and Hampson. Councilman Murr was absent. City Manager Garrett, City Attorney, Jordan, City Clerk Peck and City Engineer Thompson were present.

The following bids on construction of Paving District No. 6 were opened and read.

As the legality of the bonds for Paving District No. 6 had not been established the contract could not be let until said information was obtained.

It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Marshall that the Council further consider the bids and meet in adjourned session at 9:00 o'clock A.M. Sept. 16 1922. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Marshall that Sam B Berry be appointed Municipal Judge to serve at the pleasure of the Council, the salary of said office not to exceed \$25.00 per month. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows; Hirons, yea; Marshall, yea; Miller, yea; Meders, yea; Dowrey, yea, Hampson, yea; All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

Property owners appeared before the Council asking that they be permitted to pave the alley between Sixth and Seventh Streets and Main St. and Rood Ave. It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Meders that the property owners abutting on said alley be permitted to pave said alley under the supervision of the City Engineer. Motion carried.

Upon motion of Councilman Miller seconded by Councilman Dowrey the meeting adjourned.
