

Grand Junction, Colorado
September 26, 1922

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular adjourned session at the call of the President at 11:00 o'clock A.M. with President Hirons presiding.

The Councilmen present were Hirons, Marshall, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr. Councilman Meders was absent. City Manager Garrett, City Attorney Jordan, City Clerk Peck and City Engineer Thompson were present.

A telegram establishing the legality of the Bonds of Paving Dist. # 6, from Bosworth and Chanute was read.

The following resolution was introduced and read.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS bids for the construction of the paving of South Ave Seventh Street between the south line of Main Street and the North line of Third Avenue according to the plans and specifications on file in the office of the City Clerk, were asked for in Paving District No. 6, and

WHEREAS at the time and place designated in the notice to bidders, bids were opened, and

WHEREAS the STRANGE AND MAGUIRE PAVING COMPANY of the City of Salt Lake, Utah was found to be the lowest, reliable and responsible bidder, whose bid was in the sum of \$36,530.29.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO.

Section 1. That the bid of \$36,530.29 of STRANGE AND MAGUIRE PAVING COMPANY of the City of Salt Lake, Utah be accepted, and that a contract be entered into between the City of Grand Junction and said contractor according to and embracing said notice to bidders, and said plans and specifications and that said contract, first to be approved by the City Council, be signed by the City Manager of the City of Grand Junction for the City of Grand Junction, and that the contractor furnish the necessary bonds for the construction of said work and complying

with the terms of said contract, which said bonds must be subject to the approval of the City Council.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows: Hirons, yea; Marshall, yea; Dowrey, yea; Miller, yea; Murr, yea; Hampson, yea. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried, and the resolution duly adopted.

Moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the meeting adjourn to the call of the President. Motion carried.
