## Grand Junction, Colorado October 9, 1922

All the Councilmen being duly notified the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular adjourned session at the call of the President at 7:30 P.M. The Councilmen present were Hirons, Miller, Marshall, Dowrey, and Hampson. Councilmen Murr, and Meders were absent. City Manager Garrett, City Attorney Jordan and City Clerk Peck were present.

Mr. De Boer landscape architect appeared before the Council submitting a proposition for the improvement and plotting of the Cemetary and Lincoln Park. Mr. De Boer was present on the request of City Manager Garrett.

It was moved by Councilman Marshall, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that the City Manager be authorized tonenter into a contract with Mr. De Boer for the designing and plotting of the cemetary and Lincoln Park. The terms of the contract to call for detailed plans and preliminary estimates for the sum of \$500.00 and a payment of \$150.00 per year for two years for supervision on the construction of said parks. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Councilmen present voted as follows, Hirons, yea; Marshall, yea; Dowrey, yea; Hampson, yea. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

It was moved by Councilman Marshall, seconded by Councilman Miller that the meeting adjourn until 7:30 P.M. Oct. 11 1922. Motion carried.
