

Grand Junction, Colorado
November 1, 1922

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo., met in regular session at 8:00 o'clock P.M. with President Hirons presiding, at which meeting there were present and answering at roll call: President of the Council, W.G. Hirons, Councilman: Marshall, Miller, Dowrey, Murr and Hampson, City Manager Garrett, City Clerk Peck, City Attorney Jordan and City Engineer Thompson were present. Councilman Meders was absent.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and of the adjourned meetings of Oct. 9 1922, Oct. 11, 1922 and of Oct. 24, 1922 were read and approved.

M.H. Loffler and Wm. Weiser were present in behalf of the Chamber of Commerce asking that the City Council include a certain sum in the budget for the year 1922 for the purpose of advertising. Said amount to be turned over to the Chamber of Commerce for said use only.

It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Marshall that \$500.00 be included in the budget for the year 1923 to be turned over to the Chamber of Commerce for advertising purposes only. Upon which motion the following vote was cast:

Those voting Aye: Councilmen Hirons, Marshall, Miller, Dowrey, Murr and Hampson

Those voting Nay: None.

All the Councilmen present voting Aye, the motion was declared carried.

President W.G. Hirons read the following estimate in connection with City of Grand Junction Paving District No. 6, being Estimate No. 1.

It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Murr that the Foregoing estimate of the city engineer be accepted, upon which motion the following vote was cast:

Councilmen voting Aye: Hiron, Marshall, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr.

Councilmen voting Nay: None.

The President of the Council and City Clerk were thereupon instructed to issue bonds numbered consecutively from one (1) to twelve (12), inclusive, in the denomination of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) each, and deliver said bonds to Bosworth, Chanute and Company of Denver, Colorado, the lawful purchaser thereof.

A petition for the paving of Gunnison Ave. from the east side of Seventh Street to the west side of Twelfth Street was presented and read. It was moved by Councilman Murr seconded by Councilman Hampson that the petition be accepted and placed on file. Motion carried.

A petition from Mr. and Mrs. A.F. Jarvis asking that the Council make some provision as to the Grace Hospital at 1003 Rood Ave claiming that the same has been a nuisance was presented and read. No action was taken on this matter as there is nothing in the Charter and Ordinance of the City of Grand Junction to cover same.

It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Murr that the meeting adjourn to 7:30 o'clock P.M. November 3 1922 at which time bids are to be received on certain proposed bond issues.
