Grand Junction, Colorado November 3, 1922

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo., met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Hirons presiding, at which meeting there were present and answering to roll call: President of the Council W.G. Hirons, Councilmen Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr, City Manager Garrett, City Attorney Jordan and City Clerk Peck.

A petition from Sam Pantuso asking permission from the Council to move his store building from it's present location at Fifth St. and Ouray Ave. to Lots 2-3-4-5-6 in Block 6 of Mobley's Subdivision was presented. It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the petition be accepted and placed on file. Motion carried.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS in the opinion of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction sufficient sidewalk have been laid in the vicinity of Block 43 in said city to make it reasonable that intervening sidewalks not laid should be provided with sidewalks.

WHEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a sidewalk on the east side of Lot 17, in Block 43 in the City of Grand Junction, be and the same is hereby ordered constructed within thirty days from the date of the service of notice upon the owner, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify the owner of said lot to construct said sidewalk, said notice to be given as required by the Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction.

It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Murr that the resolution as read be passed and adopted, on which motion the following vote was cast:

Councilman voting Aye: Hirons, Miller, Dowrey, hampson, Murr.

Councilman voting Nay: None.

All the Councilman present voting yea the motion was declared carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Murr, that the Banker's Trust Co and Bosworth, Chanute and Co being the highest and best bidder on the proposed bond issues heretofore tabulated be awarded said bonds subject to certain conditions heretofore set forth in certain resolutions of the City Council on Oct. 24 1922, upon which motion the following vote was cast:

Councilmen voting Aye: Hirons, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson, Murr.

Councilmen voting Nay: None.

All the Councilmen present voting yea the motion was carried and the President of the City Council and City Clerk were authorized to enter into a contract for the selling of said bonds.

Julius Pearce representing the Julius Pearce Fire Department Supply Co. of Denver appeared before the Council at the request of the City Manager to discuss the installing of a Fire Alarm System in the City of Grand Junction. The Council took the matter under advisement.

There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Miller that the Council adjourn to the call of the President. Motion carried.
