

Grand Junction, Colorado

November 20, 1922

All the Councilmen being duly notified the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Hirons presiding. There were present and answering to roll call; President of the Council W.G. Hirons, Councilmen Marshall, Miller, Meders, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr, Acting City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Jordan and City Clerk Peck. Absent City Manager Garrett.

A representation from the West Side appeared before the Council and thro their spokesman A. Allison requested that the Council take some action to-ward compelling the Denver and Rio Grande Western Ry. Co. to protect the public where their right-of way crosses West Main Street. Said action being necessary at this time as the Railroad Company were extending their tracks at this point, making a very dangerous crossing.

It was moved by Councilman Marshall, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that the President appoint a committee to wait on Mr. McKinnon, Supt. to ascertain just what action the Railroad Company was to take regarding said West Main Street Crossing, Motion carried. The President then appointed the following to act: Councilmen Murr and Marshall, City Attorney Jordan and Acting City Manager Thompson.

The proof of publication of the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE WATER SYSTEM" was read. It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Marshall that the proof be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

It was then moved by Councilman Marshal, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that the proposed ordinance be brought up for final passage. Motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Councilman Marshall, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE WATER SYSTEM" be passed and adopted, numbered 325 and ordered published, upon which motion the following vote was cast:

Councilmen voting Aye: Hiron, Marshall, Miller, Meders, Dowrey, Hampson, Murr.

Councilmen voting Nay: None.

All the Councilmen voting Aye, the motion was declared carried and the ordinance duly adopted.

There being no protest filed with the Clerk it was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Marshall that Samo Patuso be given a permit to move his store building from the Corner of Fourth and Ouray Ave. to Lots 1-2-3-4-5-and 6 in Block 8, Mobley's Subdivision to the City of Grand Junction, Colo. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, the Council adjourned until 3:00 o'clock P.M. November 21.
