December 4, 1922

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 O'clock P.M. at the City Hall. Those present and answering to roll call: President of the Council W.G. Hirons, Councilmen L.O. Marshall, Reed Miller, W.E. Meders, W.R. Dowrey, T.J. Hampson and Wm. Murr, City Manager Geo. Garrett, City Clerk Peck and City Attorney Jordan.

Wm. Murr reported that Mr. Marshall, Geo. Garrett and himself had interviewed the officials of the Denver and Rio Grande Westers at Denver in regard to the railroad crossing on West Main Street. The officials stated that the Railroad Company would probably be willing to pay one-half the cost of building a subway under this crossing if the City would pay for the other half. No definite statement was or agreement was obtained from said D and R.G. officials.

The President of the Council and City Clerk were thereupon instructed to issue bonds numbered consecutively from Thirteen (13) to Fifty-Three (53), inclusive, in the denomination of Five Hundred Dollars (500.) each, and deliver said bonds to Bosworth,

Chanute & Company of Denver, Colorado, the lawful purchaser thereof.

Whereas the City Council has been asked to submit to the qualified electors of the City of Grand Junction for their adoption or rejection, an ordinance providing for the vacation of a certain alley included in Block 9 of Richard D. Mobley's First Subdivision to the City of Grand Junction,

Whereas such an ordinance has been prepared entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE VACATING OF THAT CERTAIN ALLEY RUNNING NORTH AND SOUTH IN BLOCK 9 OF RICHARD D. MOBLEY'S FIRST SUBDIVISION TO THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION AND IN BOWER'S SUBDIVISION OF LOT 3 IN BLOCK 9 OF RICHARD D. MOBLEY'S First SUBDIVISION TO THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION,"

Therefore be it resolved, that the said ordinance be and the same is hereby submitted to the qualified electors at the special election to be held Friday, the 22nd day of December 1922, for their adoption or rejection.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Marshall that the resolution as read be passed and adopted and that the City Clerk be instructed to have the ordinance published as required by the Charter and ordinances of the City of Grand Junction, upon which motion the following vote was cast:
