The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo, met in regular adjourned session, in full conformity with law and the ordinances, rules and charter of said City, at the City Hall in said city, being the usual place of meeting of said Council, at which meeting there were present and answering to roll call: President of the Council: W.G. Hirons, Councilmen; R.G. Miller, T.J. Hampson, and Wm. Murr. City Manager George Garrett, City Cler and Auditor Fred A Peck and L.W. Jordon, City Attorney.

The President of the Council and City Clerk were thereupon instructed to issue bonds numbered consecutively from fifty-four (54) to fifty-nine (59), inclusive, in the denomination of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) each, and deliver said bonds to Bosworth, Chanute and Company, of Denver, Colorado, the lawful purchaser thereof.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Miller, that the date of the final payment on Paving District No. 6 be December 26 1922. That all persons having claim should file the same with the City Treasurer on or before 7:30 O'clock P.M. on December 26 1922, and that the City Clerk be instructed to have such a notice published in the Daily Sentinel on December 13th and December 23 1922, upon which motion the following vote was cast:

Councilmen voting Aye: Hiron, Miller, Hampson and Murr.

Councilmen voting Nay: None.

The President declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Miller that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
