The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, met in regular session at 8:00 o'clock P.M. with President Hirons presiding. The Councilmen present and answering to roll call were Hirons, Miller, Meders, Hampson, and Murr. Councilmen Dowrey and Marshall were absent. City Manager Garrett, City Clerk Peck and City Attorney Jordan were present

A communication from the Grand River Valley Ry. Co. requesting that in paving East Main Street the street railway passing track between Seventh and Eight Streets remain of the present type. It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Meders that the communication be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Roy Short of the Mutual Creamery appeared before the Council requesting that certain changes be made in the present Dairy Ordinance amending the same to take care of the inspection of pasteurized milk.

Thereupon it was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Murr, that the City Attorney be instructed to act with the City Physician in the drafting of an amendment to the milk ordinance, the same being in accord with the ordinances of other cities, to care for the inspection of pasteurized milk. Motion carried.

A representive of the Avery Machinery Company appeared before the Council asking them to investigate the Avery Road Maintainer and to consider the purchase on the same.

It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Meders that Miss. Ruth Newton be appointed City Treasurer to succeed Chas. H. Crawford who had resigned. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: COUNCILMEN voting AYE: Hirons, Miller, Meders, Hampson and Murr. COUNCILMEN voting NAY: None. All the Councilmen present voting YEA, the motion was declared carried and the appointment confirmed. Said appointment dating from Feb. 15 1923.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the Council adjourned upon motion of Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilmen Hampson.
