

Grand Junction, Colorado
March 7, 1923

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 P.M. with President Hiron presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Hiron, Miller, Hampson and Murr, City Manager Garrett, City Clerk Peck, City Attorney Jordan and City Engineer Thompson. Councilmen Marshall, Meders and Dowrey were absent.

Mr. Bradford Playground Supervisor was present asking that the City participate in playground activities during the coming summer. Thereupon it was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Murr that the City participate in playground activities during the summer and that the sum of \$125.00 more or less be allowed to cover the expenses. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA: Hiron, Hampson, Murr and Miller. Councilmen voting NAY: None. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

Gus, Johnson, Wallace and Jones, Commissioners of Mesa County appeared before the Council asking that some action be taken concerning the sewer connection for the new County Court House. The Commissioners were informed that the City Engineer had been instructed to make detail plans and specifications and estimates of a combined sanitary and storm sewer which sewer if constructed would take care of the sewage from the new County Court House.

J.E. Ragan C.P.A. presented his report on the audit of the City Books. Thereupon it was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the report be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilman Murr that J.E. Ragan be allowed an additional fee of \$75.00 for the audit of said books. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA: Hiron, Miller, Hampson, Murr. Councilmen voting NAY: None.

Winterburn and Lumsden presented the plans for their contemplated structure on South Seventh Street. The same were ordered filed.

The proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 313 ENTITLED 'AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE WATER RATES OR RENTS AND THE COLLECTION THEREOF AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS THEREOF IN CONFLICTION WITH THIS ORDINANCE' PASSED AND ADOPTED THE 22ND DAY OF MARCH, 1922, BY ADDING THERETO A NEW SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION NINE" was introduced and read.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Miller that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

A petition signed by J.A. Dixon et. al. remonstrating against the contemplated erection by Winterburn and Lumsden of a building on South Seventh was presented and read. It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the petition be accepted and filed for future reference. Motion carried.

The City Engineer presented maps, estimates and specifications in connection of the proposed Paving District #8. Said maps, plans and specifications being for three different types of paving.

It was moved by Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilman Murr that the maps, estimates and specifications presented by the City Engineer be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

The proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE SALARY OF THE CITY ATTORNEY" was presented and read.

Thereupon it was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Miller that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

The minutes of the following meetings were read and approved:

The bond of J.A. Dixon as master plumber was accepted and filed upon motion of Councilman Murr and seconded by Councilman Miller. Said bond having been approved by the City Attorney.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting adjourned until 7:30 o'clock March 14 1923.
