

Grand Junction, Colorado

April 25, 1923

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular adjourned session at 8:00 o'clock P.M. with President Hiron presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Hiron, Marshall, Hampson and Murr, City Manager Garrett, City Clerk Peck and City Attorney Jordan. Councilman Meders, Dowrey and Miller were absent.

Representatives from the three banks of the City were present at the request of the Council to discuss the matter of providing more security for the money of the City deposited in said banks.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Hampson that a committee composed of the City Manager, City Treasurer and City Auditor compile a statement showing how long the bulk of the money would be on deposit at the banks. Motion carried.

The following resolution was introduced and read.

RESOLUTION

Whereas, consideration of the ordering of the proposed improvements in the proposed Paving District No. 8, in the City of Grand Junction, was on the 18th day of April, A.D. 1923, at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, by the Council continued to this date; and

Whereas the City Council desires further time in which to consider the ordering of said proposed improvements in the Proposed Paving District No. 8 in the City of Grand Junction.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO.

That further consideration of the ordering of the proposed improvements in the proposed Paving District No. 8 in the City of Grand Junction be and the same is hereby continued to the 27th day of April A.D. 1923, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M. on said day, or as soon thereafter as the Council can consider the same.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. The motion being put, upon call of roll the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA: Hiron, Marshall, Hampson and Murr, Councilmen voting NAY: None. All the Councilmen present voting YEA the motion was declared carried and the resolution duly passed and adopted.

Henry R. Rhone appeared before the Council in regard to the running of irrigation water in the city during the summer. It was suggested that the City Manager make an investigation of the 12th Street ditch to see if the continuance of the same was warranted.

City Engineer T.E. Thompson presented maps, descriptions and estimates of the Proposed Storm Sewer District No. 1. No action was taken by the Council concerning the same.

Upon motion of Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Marshall that the meeting adjourn until Friday, April 27th 1923 at the hour of 1923. Motion carried.
