It was moved by Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Miller that the estimates as read be accepted and allowed, upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting yea, Hampson, Meders, Dowrey and Miller. Councilmen voting nay, none. All the Councilmen present voting yea the motion was declared carried. It was moved by Councilman Dowrey and seconded by Councilman Miller that the act of the City Treasurer in depositing funds in the bank of The American Bank & Trust Company of Denver from the sale of Bonds of Paving District No. 8 and combined Sewer District No. 1 be ratified. The American Bank & Trust Company to give a depository bond on the amount deposited, and to also pay to the City of Grand Junction 3% interest on the funds so deposited. Motion carried.

An application from B. L. Cook requesting that a permit be given him to erect a garage and Filling Station at the corner of Seventh St. and North Avenue, was presented. It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Meders that the application be filed for future action. Motion carried.

A communication from The Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Co. in regard to the hiring of watchmen at the Colorado Ave. crossing was read. It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Meders that the communication be referred to the City Attorney for his attention. Motion carried.

A communication was read from N. T. Nelson requesting that the city take the necessary steps to prevent the excessive use of water on certain lots situated on White Ave. between 12th and 13th streets and owned by Henry R. Rhone. It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Meders that this matter be turned over to the City Manager. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Meders that a certain part of the Cemetery to be selected by the City Manager, be used exclusively for the internment of colored people. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Miller, that the bids for the removal of the old exhibition hall and the construction of a new one be rejected, the price being too high and that the City Manager ask for new bids on the same with changes as suggested by him. Motion carried.
