

August 30, 1923
Grand Junction, Colorado

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado met in regular adjourned session at 11:00 o'clock A.M. with the following present: Councilman Hirons, Hampson, Murr, Miller and Meders, Acting City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Jordan and City Clerk Peck. City Manager Garrett and Councilmen Marshall and Dowrey were absent.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Miller that the action taken by the Council on August 29th, 1923 in readvertising for new bids on bonds for Paving District No. 9 be rescinded. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the offer of Boettcher, Porter and Company, of Denver Colorado of par plus accrued interest on 5 1/2% bonds of Paving District No. 9 be accepted, and that the President of the Council be authorized to enter into a contract for the sale of said bonds. Upon this motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA: Hirons, Hampson, Murr, Miller and Meders. All the Councilmen present voting YEA, the motion was declared carried.

Mr. J.A. Measures appeared before the Council in regard to the curb along the parking of the Post Office property. Mr. Measures stated that permission should be obtained from the Government to use the granite curb when putting in the pavement instead of constructing a new concrete curb.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Meders that Mr. Measures telegraph the government officials asking them for permission to use the granite curb, moving the same out to conform with the rest of the curbing on Rood Ave, the City Engineer to order the curb constructed as wished by the Post Office authorities. Motion carried.

Upon motion of Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilman Meders the meeting adjourned.
