## Grand Junction, Colorado

September 5, 1923

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 8:00 o'clock P.M. with President Hirons presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Hirons, Meders, Hampson and Murr, Miller, City Manager Garrett, City Attorney Jordan and City Engineer Thompson. City Clerk Peck was present.

The minutes of the last regular session and of the adjourned session of August 8th were read and approved.

Silmon Smith, attorney for the D. & R. G. Ry. Co. appeared before the Council in the matter of the employing of crossing watchmen on West Main Street the City paying the men appointed for their services. It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Meders that further time be taken to consider the matter of payment of watchmen at the D.&.R.G. Ry. crossing at West Main St. Motion carried.

The matter of the construction of a sidewalk on Eleventh Street between Gunnison and Hill Ave. was referred to the City Manager.

The President of the Council appointed Councilman Murr & Marshall as a committee to meet with Receiver Become of the D. & R. G. Ry. Co regarding a subway on West Main Street and also regarding the payment of crossing watchmen employed on this crossing.

It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Murr that the application for a permit to erect a structure over the sidewalk requested by The Boller Auto Company at their place of business at the corner of Seventh Street and Rood Ave be denided as the same would be establishing a dangerous precedent. Upon this motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA: Hirons, Meders, Hampson, Miller and Murr. All the Councilmen present voting Yea the motion was declared carried.

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS according to the plans and survey of the Engineers employed by the City of Grand Junction for the improvement and enlargement of the City Water Works, the new pipe line from the city reservoirs is to cross the following described tract of land situate in Mesa County, Colorado, to-wit:

Lot 17 in Block 35 of Moon and Day Subdivision of Orchard Mesa Heights; and

WHEREAS it is necessary for the completion of said pipe line that a right of way across said above described land is as follows, to-wit:

A tract of land 20 feet wide, 10 feet at right angles on each side of a center line described as follows: Beginning at a point 78.03 feet East of the Southwest corner of Lot 17 in Block 35 of Moon and Day Subdivision of Orchard Mesa Heights, Mesa County, Colorado, thence North 28 degrees and 44 minutes East 50 feet more or less to river bank, containing 0.02 acres more or less.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO:

Section 1. That said right-of-way as above described is necessary for the completion of the improvements and enlargements of the City Water System.

Section 2. That the City Attorney is hereby authorized to see what said right-of-way can be purchased for, and make report of same at the next meeting of the Council.

It was moved by Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Miller that the resolution as read be passed and adopted, upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA: Hirons, Miller, Meders, Hampson and Murr. All the Councilmen present voting YEA, the motion was declared carried.

V. R. Bush, Contractor presented his surety bond for \$9,000.00 for the construction of the Exhibition Hall at Lincoln Park, the same being approved by the City Attorney. It was moved by Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

The Motor Transportation Company made application to install a Clear Vision gasolene pump at their place of business, corner Main and Seventh Sts. It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Meders that a revocable permit for the installation of said pump be gived said company. Motion carried.

Upon motion of Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Meders that the Councilman adjourn until 8:00 o'clock P.M. September 11 1923. Motion carried.
