## Grand Junction, Colorado

## Oct. 15, 1923

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo., met in regular adjourned session at 8:00 o'clock P.M. with President Hirons presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Hirons, Medders, Dowrey and Murr. Councilmen Hampson, Marshall, and Miller were absent. City Manager Garrett, City Clerk Peck, City Engineer Thompson were present. City Attorney Jordan was absent.

A paving petition calling for the paving of North Seventh Street from Teller Ave. to North Ave. was presented and read. It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Meders that the petition be accepted and filed.

It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that the City Clerk be authorized to advertise for bids on the construction of Comb. Sewer District # 2, said bids to be considered by the Council at 8:00 o'clock P.M. November 1 1923. Upon this motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA, Hirons, Meders, Dowrey and Murr. All the Councilmen present voting YEA, the motion was declared carried.

Mr. Buthorne appeared before the Council asking that the property owners in Pav. Dist. # 9 be permitted to install 15 light standards on Seventh Street instead of ten. It was moved by Councilman Murr, Seconded by Councilman Meders that the request of Mr. Buthorne be granted with the understanding that only ten of the lights be lighted, the lights at the alley intersections remaining unlit. Motion carried. The following estimate was presented and read:
