

Grand Junction, Colorado

November 19, 1923

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colo., met in special session at 7:30 P/M with President Hirons presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Hirons, Marshall, Meders, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr, City Attorney Jordan, Acting City Manager Garrett and City Clerk Peck.

The President of the Council stated that the purpose of the meeting was to hear a report from the committee named to recommend a municipal judge.

The Committee recommended Chas. H. Crawford for said place to fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Henry Grubbs.

It was then moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Meders that Chas. H. Crawford be appointed to the position as Municipal Judge said appointment to take effect November 20 1923. Upon this motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting Yea, Hirons, Marshall, Miller, Dowrey, Meders, Hampson and Murr. All the Councilmen voting Yea, the president declared the motion carried.

An emergency ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING SALARY OF POLICE MAGISTRATE" was introduced and read. It was moved by Councilman Marshall, seconded by Councilman Murr that the ordinance as read be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance, numbered 339 and published in the Daily Sentinel the official newspaper of the City of Grand Junction, upon this motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting Yea, Hirons, Marshall, Meders, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr. All the Councilmen voting yea, the president declared the motion carried.

A bill for \$500.00 from S.N. Wheeler for legal services performed for the city was presented. It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Marshall that the bill be allowed. Upon the motion the following vote was cast Councilmen voting yea: Hirons, Marshall, Meders, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr. All the Councilmen voting yea the president declared the motion carried.

A bill from the Denver and Rio Grande Western Ry, Co for the sum of \$213.40 for service of crossing watchmen was presented. No action was taken on the matter.
