It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Meders that the ordinance as read be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance numbered 343 and published in the official paper of the City of Grand Junction, upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting Yea: Hirons, Marshall, Meders, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr. All the Councilmen voting Yea, the President declared the motion carried.
