Mr. Crews having appeared before the Council and asked permission to erect a brick even for his bakery, it was moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that Mr. Crews be granted permission to erect a brick even in rear of the building at 615 Colorado avenue.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners present.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the hereinafter described property was sold for taxes on delinquent paving assessment on December 16, 1913, for \$567.90, the said property being described as follows, to-wit: W. 15 ft. lot 27 and 5. 50 ft. of N. 75 ft. of lots 28 to 32 inclusive, in Block 123, in the city of Grand Junction, in Mesa county, Colorado, and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the City Council the said real estate is not worth more than the said sum plus the general taxes assessed against said real estate and now payable, and it is for the best interests of the City to dispose of said certificate; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City Treasurer be and hereby is authorized to sell said certificate for \$567.90.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that Wm. C. Herrmann be appointed Chief of Police for the ensuing term.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and Wm. C. Herrmann duly appointed as Chief of Police for the ensuing term.
