The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

Mr. Merrill, Mayor of Fruita appeared before the Council in regard to the purchase of the Ford fire apparatus by the Town of Fruita. Moved by Commissioner Peck that the Ford Fire Apparatus be sold to the Town of Fruita for the sum of \$1500.00 providing that suitable terms could be arrived at. Also providing that the City of Grand Junction to have the use of the apparatus until the Seagrave Truck could be overhauled. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners present voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Peck, yea. All the Commissioners present voting yea the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, second by Commissioner Blackstone that N. P. Peterson be given the job of overhauling the Seagrave Fire Truck. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners present voted as follows, Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Peck, yea. All the Commissioners present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

Mr. Burtun appeared before the council asking permission to tap the water main on Orchard Mesa so as to increase the water supply at the I.O.O.F. cemetery. Moved by Commissioner Garber, second by Commissioner Peck that the necessary taps be made until other arrangements could be made to take care of the water supply to the cemeteries. Motion carried.

Bids for the installation of one Fairbanks- Morse Truck Scale were opened. B.E. Slusser being the lowest and best bidder. Moved by Commissioner Blackstone second by Commissioner Peck that B.E. Slusser be awarded the contract of installing the scales for his bid of \$205.00. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners present voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Peck yea. All the Commissioners present voting yea the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, second by Commissioner Peck that B.E. Slusser give bond for the sum of \$300.00 to cover the proper installation of the scales. Motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, second by Commissioner Peck that the request for a permit to build an open air motion picture show be referred to the Mayor and the Fire Chief for their recommendation. Motion carried. Moved by Commissioner Garber, second by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be instructed and authorized to purchase the following supplies for the Water Department 2000 feet, 6 in. Class C Cast Iron pipe @ \$71.50 per ton. 2, 6 in. H.E. Tees; 5, 6 in. H.E. Crosses; 4, 6 in Plugs @ \$116.50 per ton. 11, 6 in. H.E. Ludlow Gate Valves, left to open, @ \$27.25 each. All freight allowed to Grand Junction. The motion being put upon call of roll the Commissioners present voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Pack, yea. All the Commissioners voting yea the motion was declared carried.
