

Grand Junction, Colo.

January 16 1924

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at the hour of 7:30 P.M. with President Hirons presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Hirons, Marshall, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr. Councilman Meders came in late. City Manager Garrett, City Clerk Peck and City Attorney Jordan were present.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

A bill amounting to \$426.90 from the D. & R.C. Ry. Co. for one half of the amount due crossing watchmen on West Main St was presented. It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Miller that the same be referred to the City Attorney for investigation. Motion carried.

Carl O Santesson, ade application for a permit to install a gasolene tank and pump at 735 Rood. Ave. It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the permit be granted on the approval of the Chief of the Fire Department. Motion carried.

J.H. Dodson presented a claim for 305 yards of gravel which he claimed was hauled from his property by the city. It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that the bill be referred to the City Engineer. Motion carried.

A communication from Mrs. L.F. Perry protesting the Paving of White Ave. was read. No action was taken on this communication as the petition for the paving of White Ave. had not been filed.

A proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ARTICLE 3, PASSED AND ADOPTED FEBRUARY 19, 1900 AND ENTITLED 'AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING WATERWORKS AND TO REPEAL CERTAIN OTHER ORDINANCES", was presented and read. It was moved by Councilman Murr, seconded by Councilman Marshall that the ordinance be passed for publication, upon which motion the following vote was cast, Councilmen voting Yea, Marshall, Hirons, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr. All the councilmen present voting yea, the president declared the motion carried.

A proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE LICENSING, REGULATING PUBLIC HOTELS? ROOMING HOUSES, LODGING HOUSES? WITHIN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION AND DEFINING WHAT ARE PUBLIC HOTELS? ROOMING HOUSES, LODGING HOUSES WITHIN THE MEANING OF THIS ORDINANCE" was introduced and read. It was moved by Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Marshall that the ordinance as read be passed for publication, upon which motion the following vote was cast,

Councilmen voting Yea, Hiron, Marshall, Meders, Miller, Dowrey, Hampson and Murr. All the Councilmen voting Yea, the President declared the motion carried.

J.P. Jeffries was present protesting against the licensing of news stands. A communication from him was also read. Mr. Jeffries was informed that the ordinance licensing news stands did not come up for passage until the next regular meeting.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the Council.
