All the Councilmen being duly notified the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at 8:00 o'clock P.M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen: Murr, Hampson. Miller, Dowrey and Bear, City Manager Garrett, City Clerk Peck and City Engineer Thompson. Councilman Hirons and Meders were absent also City Attorney Jordan.

Upon motion of Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Miller, Councilman Murr was selected to act as President Pro Tem in the absence of President Hirons.

Mr. Henry Tupper appeared as counsel for J.W. Watson in regard to the reduction of water rates for the Watson green houses.

Moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Bear that the matter of adjustment of water rates be laid over until the next meeting to the disposed of at that time. Motion carried.

A letter from the Public Utilities Commission in regard to the Application of

J.T. Barnett for a permit for a gas pipe line from Cisco Utah to this City was read. Councilman Miller moved, seconded by Councilman Dowrey that the matter be referred to the City Attorney and Attorney Burgess, they to take the matter up with the Public Utilities commission and to ask that the hearing be held in this city. Motion carried.

Councilman Hampson moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that B.J. Snyder be appointed as assistant Police Judge to take charge of the Municipal Court during the absence of Judge Crawford. Motion carried.

The City Engineer presented a map showing primary and secondary streets of the City. The map was ordered made by the Council to enable them to designate the streets that should be paved with hard surface pavement.

It was moved by Councilman Dowrey, seconded by Councilman Miller that the City Council accept said map and plan as detailed by the City Engineer and that the same be filed. Motion carried unanimously.

Upon motion of Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Miller the Council adjourned.
