

Grand Junction, Colorado  
February 4, 1925

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 8:00 o'clock P.M. with President Hirons presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Hirons, Hampson, Miller, Meders & Murr. City Manager Garrett, City Clerk Peck & City Attorney Tupper were present. Councilmen Bear & Dowrey were absent.

J.A. Kreps made a request to have the newsstand license of J.E. Robinson transferred to him. Upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Murr, the same was ordered transferred.

The Van Horn Drug Company was granted a soft drink license upon motion of Councilman Hampson, seconded by Councilman Meders.

RADERS BOND

The plumber's bond of J.W. Rader was accepted and approved by the Council upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Miller. The same having the approval of the City Attorney.

ORDINANCE #375

The proof of publication of the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING ELECTIONS IN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION?, COLORADO" WAS READ. Upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Murr the proof of publication was accepted and ordered filed.

Councilman Hampson moved, seconded by Councilman Miller that the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING ELECTIONS IN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO" be brot up for final passage. Motion carried unanimously.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE INTERSECTIONS

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING ELECTIONS IN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO" be passed and adopted as read, numbered 375 and published. Upon which motion the following vote was cast; Councilmen present voting Yea. Hirons, Meders, Miller, Hampson & Murr. Councilmen voting Nay: None. All the Councilmen present voting yea, the President declared the motion carried and the ordinance duly passed and adopted.

A proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CALLING AN ELECTION AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE VOTE OF THE QUALIFIED TAXPAYING ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, A QUESTION OF AUTHORIZING THE CITY COUNCIL OF SAID CITY TO ISSUE THE NEGOTIABLE COUPON BONDS OF THE CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COST OF PAVING STREET & ALLEY INTERSECTIONS IN SAID CITY; PROVIDING FOR THE

ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS; IF AUTHORIZED, PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS AND THE INTEREST THEREON" was introduced and read. Councilman Murr moved, seconded by Councilman Miller that the proposed ordinance as just read be passed for publication, upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen present voting yea, Hiron, Meders, Miller, Hampson & Murr. Councilmen voting nay: None. All the Councilmen present voting yea the President declared the motion carried.

A proposed ordinance entitled: AN ORDINANCE CALLING AN ELECTION AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE VOTE OF THE QUALIFIED TAXPAYING ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, THE QUESTION OF AUTHORIZING THE CITY COUNCIL OF SAID CITY TO ISSUE THE NEGOTIABLE COUPON BONDS OF THE CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING ONE HALF THE COST OF PAVING FIRST STREET IN SAID CITY FROM THE NORTH LINE ON MAIN STREET TO THE NORTH CITY LIMIT LINE, EXCLUSIVE OF THE COST OF THE PAVING OF THE STREET & ALLEY INTERSECTIONS IN SAID STREET, AND EXCLUSIVE OF THE PORTION OF THE COST OF SAID IMPROVEMENT TO BE PAID BY THE BOOK CLIFF RAILROAD COMPANY, PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS, IF AUTHORIZED, PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS AND THE INTEREST THEREON" was introduced & read. Councilman Murr moved, seconded by Councilman Hampson that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication, upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen present voting yea, Hiron, Miller, Meders, Hampson & Murr. Councilmen voting Nay; None. All the Councilmen present voting Yea, the President declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, the City Council adjourned until 11:00 A.M. Friday, February 6th, 1925.
