The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. All the Councilmen having been previously duly notified. Those present and answering at roll call were: Councilmen Bear, Ellison, Logsden, Moslander, Short & Bell, City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Hindman, and City Clerk Peck. Councilman Meders was absent.

Dr. Lamb & Dr. Howe, State & Federal Dairy Commissioners were present in the interest of the tuberculin testing of dairy cattle. They stated that the City of Grand Junction was doing more along this line than any other city in the state and until the talk they had with the City Manager they did not know what the city was doing along this line.

City Manager Thompson brot up the question of the installation of a heating plant at Moyer Pool.

Councilman Moslander moved, seconded by Councilman Logsden that the City Manager be authorized to install a heating plant at Moyer Pool to heat the water in said pool providing that the cost of the installation would not exceed \$1600. Upon which motion all the Councilmen voted Yea, and the President declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting was adjourned upon motion of Councilman Bear, seconded by Councilman Ellison.
