Grand Junction, Colo.

June 30 1925

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. All the Councilmen having been duly notified. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Ellison, Logsden, Meders, Moslander, Short & Bell; City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Hinman & City Clerk Peck.

R.A. Ross of the Chamber of Commerce appeared in the behalf of the request of the Latimer-Goodwin Chemical Company to grant them a revocable permit to use a portion of South Seventh Street for building purposes. Other members of the Chamber of Commerce were also present.

Councilman Moslander moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that action on the Latimer Goodwin matter be deferred until July 1st, the night of the first regular meeting in July. Motion carried.

C.W. Derryberry, representing the bond firm of Sidlo, Simon, Day & Co, made a proposition for the purchase of the \$86,000 bonds of the proposed intersection issue, a letter was read from said bond firm setting forth the terms for the purchase of the same.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the offer of Sidlo, Simon, Day & Company, under date of June 25 1925 for par and accrued interest for 4 1/2% General Obligation Paving Bonds be accepted subject to the provisions of said offer providing that said bonds be serial bonds, payable in 1 to 15 years from the date of issue, and that the President of the Council and the City Clerk be authorized to sign the contract for the purchase of said bonds. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA; Bear, Ellison, Logsden, Meders, Moslander, Short & Bell. All the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the Council adjourned upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Bear.
