The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Ellison, Logsden, Meders, Moslander, Short & Bell. City Manager Thompson, City Attornet Hinman & City Clerk Peck were present.

The minutes of the last regular session and of the special session of Aug. 26th were read and approved.

C.P. Bliss appeared before the Council asking that the rate paid for labor on public works be raised so that Union labor could be employed on the work. The Council asked that they be allowed to consider the matter.

The City Manager and the President of the Council stated that Campbell had called them protesting the granting of a permit to the Cities Service Oil Co to erect tanks near the Mesa Flour Mills, As Mr. Campbell did not appear to state his case it was moved by Councilman Short, seconded by Councilman Bear that the verbal protest of Campbell be tabled for the present. Motion carried.

The following estimate, being estimate No. 2 of Contractor Winterburn & Lumsden on Sidewalk District No. 9, was presented and read.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the emergency ordinance in regard to "hopper toilets" be passed & adopted as an emergency ordinance, numbered 390 and published. Upon which motion the following vote ws cast: Councilmen voting YEA?, Ber, Ellison, Logsden, Meders, Moslander Short & Bell. All the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried and the ordinance duly passed and adopted.

Councilman Moslander & Councilman Ellison were appointed by the President to confer with the School Board in regard to the hiring of a Community Service Director.

Councilman Moslander moved, seconded by Councilman Short that the Council extend to the American Legion, Dept. of Colo. an invitation to hold thier 1926 convention in the City of Grand Junction. Motion carried unanimously.

The following resolution was introduced and read.

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO that the lunch cars situated on the north & south side of Main Street at the corner of Third Street be and the same are hereby declared to be a nuisance because they constitute fire hazards within the fire limits of the City and were erected without a permit being issued and for the further reason that proper sanitation is not observed, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, that the Building Inspector be directed to order the removal thereof within thirty days.

Council Bear moved, seconded by Councilman Ellison that the resolution

as read be passe and adopted. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilman voting Yea, Bear, Ellison, Meders, Logsden, Moslander, Short & Bell. All the Councilmen voting Yea, the President declared the motion carried and the resolution duly passed and adopted.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Mear that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
