

Grand Junction, Colo.

September 16 1925

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Ellison, Logsdan, Meders, Moslander, Short & Bell; City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Hinman & City Clerk Peck.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

The Robinson Service Corporation filed an application for the installation of a gasoline tank station on railroad property located at the south end of Sixth Street, a plat showing said location was filed with the application. It was explained that the location formerly granted did not comply with the building ordinance.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the Robinson Service Corporation be granted a permit to erect a gasoline tank station on Railroad property located near the south end of Sixth Street and as shown by a plat filed with the application and that the permit granted the Robinson Service Corporation on August 19 1925 at a different location be revoked. The motion was unanimously carried.

The proof of publication of the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING WATER RATES OR RENTS" was read by the Clerk. Upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Bear the proof of publication was accepted and ordered filed.

The proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Councilman Moslander thereupon moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the ordinance be laid on the table. Motion carried.

The proof of publication of the proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING ASHES; THE STORAGE AND DEPOSIT THEREOF IN RECEPTACLES AND PITS; THE REQUIREMENTS OF CONSTRUCTION OF ASH PITS AND RECEPTACLES FOR ASHES AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF" was read by the clerk. Upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Moslander the proof of publication was accepted and ordered filed.

The proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the proposed ordinance be brot up for final passage. Motion carried.

It was thereupon moved by Councilman Short, seconded by Councilman Bear that the proposed ordance as read be passed and adopted and numbered 391. Upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA, Bear, Ellison, Logsdan, Meders, Moslander, Short & Bell. All the Councilmen voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried and the ordinance duly passed and adopted.

F.P. Friedman, C.P. Blackwell, L. Storm & others appeared before the Council protesting the construction of sidewalks on the west side of Blk 149 & on the north side of block 162. No definite action by the Council was taken.

C.P. Bliss appeared before the Council asking that they reconsider their action of Sept 2nd in regard to the lunch car situated on the North side of Main St at Third Street.

The committee composed of C.D. Moslander & O.H. Ellison reported that they had met with the School Board to take up the matter of the employing of a Community Service Director. They stated that the agreement made with the School Board was that they (The School Board) would pay \$100.00 of the Directors monthly salary, the City to pay \$50.00. The Director to be under the direction of the School Board for 9 months of the

year or during the school term. During the summer months the Director would be under the supervision of the City Manager. The committee also recommended that the City appropriate \$300.00 for equipment and \$600.00 for salaries of playground instructors in charge of the different playgrounds during the summer.

Thereupon Councilman Bear moved, seconded by Councilman Short that the report of the Committee be accepted. The motion carried.

The City Clerk presented a petition for the paving of Grand Ave., from First St. to Thirteenth St, the same having been filed in his office on September 9 1925.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the petition be placed on file and that the same be checked over to ascertain if the required amount of frontage had been secured. Motion carried.

Councilman Short moved, seconded by Councilman Meders that a committee be appointed to investigate, with the City Manager, the different types of pavement laid in other cities in the state and to also inspect the different water systems, especially the pipe used for flow line purposes.

The motion carried unanimously and the President appointed the following Committee: Councilman Ellison, Bear, Moslander & Meders.

Upon motion of Councilman Ellison, seconded by Councilman Meders the Council adjourned.
