

Grand Junction, Colorado

October 28, 1925

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bell, Ellison, Logsden, Meders & Moslander. City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Hinman and City Clerk Peck. Councilmen Bear and Short were absent.

F.D. Payne and C.E. Cherrington appeared before the Council asking that a certain amount of the interest due tax sale certificates held by the city on lots in Dundee Place be cancelled so that the certificates could be redeemed by the St. Matthews Church. Moved by Councilman Moslander, seconded by Councilman Ellison that this matter be laid over until the next meeting so that an investigation could be made. Motion carried.

Upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Logsden that the cigarette & soft drink license of Bishop & Cromer be transferred to E.H. Mc Kelvie. Motion carried.

Moved by Councilman Ellison, seconded by Councilman Logsden that the City Manager prepare plans and estimates of different types of ash pits and that the City Council recommend the same to the public. Motion carried.

The City Clerk was instructed to write the Public Utilities Commission regarding the defective warning bell at the railway crossing on South Seventh Street and to also request them to ask the D. & R. G. Ry Co to connect said bell with the several switch tracks crossing South Seventh Street.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Logsden that the City Clerk notify the licensed bicycle riders of the City that they would not be permitted to use the sidewalks except when actually engaged in their occupation and on failure to comply with this regulation the Council would

revoke their license. Furthermore the Council would revoke the license of any rider who ran into or over a pedestrian using the sidewalks. Motion carried.

The following resolution was presented and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS D.B. Short, Councilman from District "C", City of Grand Junction has moved from the City and from the district where he resided and is now living elsewhere, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Short has not tendered his resignation to the Council.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO.

That a vacancy in the Office of Councilman from District "C" be declared to exist and that his successor be appointed as provided by the Charter of the City.

Councilman Ellison thereupon moved, seconded by Councilman Logsden that the resolution as read be passed and adopted, upon which motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA: Ellison, Logsden, Meders, Moslander & Bell. All the Councilmen present voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried.

Councilmen Logsden then moved, seconded by Councilman Ellison that Mr. W.J. Moyer be appointed as Councilman from District "C", City of Grand Junction to fill the unexpired term of Councilman Short. Upon this motion the following vote was cast: Councilmen voting YEA: Ellison, Logsden, Meders, Moslander & Bell. All the Councilmen present voting YEA, the President declared the motion carried and the appointment confirmed.

Councilman Logsdan moved, seconded by Councilman Ellison that the meeting adjourned. Motion carried.
