

Grand Junction, Colorado.

November 18, 1925

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Ellison, Logsden, Meders, Moslander & Bell. City Attorney Hinman, City Manager Thompson & City Clerk Peck were present.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

A petition was presented to the Council asking for the appointment of J.A. Barraclough to the office of Councilman from District "C", said office being vacant.

A petition was filed protesting against the building of sheds ect. on the Haggerty tract on So. Fifth St.

A delegation was present requesting that the City Council grant J.A. Harrison a permit to erect sheds, corrals ect on land known as the Haggerty Tract on So. Fifth St. Those requesting said action being residents adjacent to said property.

Thereupon Councilman Logsden moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that J.A. Harrison be granted a permit to erect sheds, corrals ect. on the Haggerty Tract on So. Fifth. St. Motion carried.

Hale & Senter, Auctioneers were present asking that the Council regulate in some way the auction business in the City.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Moslander that the City Attorney be instructed to revise the Ordinance concerning licenses in the City of Grand Junction. Motion carried.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the license for Auctioneers auctioning second hand goods in the city be raised to \$75.00 per year or any part thereof. Motion carried.

The names of J.A. Barraclough & O.L. Fairley were presented as nominees to fill the vacancy of Councilman in District "C".

The following vote was cast for said candidates:

Councilmen voting for O.L. Fairley: Bear, Ellison, Logsdan, & Bell.

Councilmen voting for J.A. Baraclough: Meders & Moslander.

The majority of the votes being cast for O.L. Fairley the President of the Council declared him elected to serve as Councilman from District "C" City of Grand Junction, filling the vacancy caused by the resignation of D.B. Short.

The Currie Canning Company filed a letter asking that the City take over the expense of maintaining an arc light on their property near First Ave. & Eight Street. Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the request be tabled. Motion carried.

A petition signed by Frank Jaros et. al. requesting that the City extend the city water main north on N. 12th St. was presented. No action was taken on the petition.

A proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE LEVYING A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT ON CERTAIN REAL ESTATE IN GRAND JUNCTION, FOR BENEFITS CONFERRED BY THE WATER WORKS OF THE SAID CITY" was presented and read. Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

A proposed ordinance entitled "THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO,

PROVIDING FOR THE EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1st A.D. 1926, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31ST A.D. 1926" was introduced and read. Councilman Ellison thereupon moved, seconded by Councilman Logsdon that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication. Motion carried.

A proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING SALARIES" was introduced and read; Councilman Logsdon moved, seconded by Councilman Meders that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

A surety bond for auctioneers license was filed by F.S. Carpenter, the same having the approval of the City Attorney. Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Ellison that the bond as presented be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the Council adjourned until Nov. 30 1925 upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Moslander.
