

Grand Junction, Colo

January 20 1925

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Ellison, Logsdan Meders, Fairley, Moslander & Bell; City Manager Thompson, City Clerk Peck, and City Attorney Hinman.

The minutes of the last regular session and of the adjourned session of January 13th were read and approved.

Members of the School Board were present in regard to the water rates charged School District No. 1. The matter was referred to the committee on Water, who will report their findings to the Council at an early date.

Supt. Wilson of the Denver & Rio Grande was present requesting the Council to consider placing a cheaper pavement across their right of way, from the freight depot on So. Fifth St. to the south right of way line of the D & R.G. W. Ry. Mr. Wilson was informed that the Council had decided to place an 18 foot slab pavement with 5 foot gravel shoulders on said described portion of So. Fifth St.

Auctioneer Hale appeared before the Council asking that the Council reconsider their action at the last meeting and grant W.H. Fisher a license as auctioneer.

Councilman Bear moved, seconded by Councilman Fairley that no further action be taken in approving the bond of W.H. Fisher as Auctioneer. Motion carried.

Frank Jaros et al. were present asking that the water main on N. 12th Street be extended a quarter of a mile north. Upon motion of Councilman Moslander, seconded by Councilman Bear the matter was ordered laid on the table for future consideration.

John K Logan filed an extension to his bond as electrician, the same having the approval of the City Attorney.

Upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Bear the extension was approved and ordered filed.

The surety bonds of J.E. Broadhead as electrician and J.F. Schultz as auctioneer were presented. The bonds having the approval of the City attorney. Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Logsdan that the bonds be approved and filed. Motion carried.

Councilman Moslander moved, seconded by Councilman Ellison that the City Manager be instructed to move all junk yards out of the

boundaries of the fire limits as they are now established. Motion carried.

The bonds of two junk dealers, Joe Leff and Earp were presented, the same having the approval of the City Attorney.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Moslander that the bonds be approved and a license issued on the condition that they do not use property within the fire limits to store said junk. Motion carried.

The City Clerk reported that there were no written or other remonstrances filed with him remonstrating against the creation of Combined Sewer District No. 4.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the Council adjourned until 7:30 o'clock P.M. January 27th 1926 upon motion of Councilman Meders seconded by Councilman Bear.
