

Grand Junction, Colo.

February 3 1926

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilman; Bear, Ellison, Logsdan, Meders, Moslander, & Bell; City Manager Thompson, City Clerk Peck & City Attorney Hinman. Councilman Fairley was absent.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved.

Chas. Koehler presented a surety bond for doing plumbing work within the City. The same having the approval of the City Attorney. Upon motion of Councilman Meders, second by Councilman Bear the bond was accepted and filed.

The following made application for soft drink licenses: Beyer & Wohlfort Mesa Cigar Store, E.H. Mc Kelvie, Richardson drug Store, Van Horn Drug Store, Holly & Hinter, R.G. Miller, Interstate Cigar Store, Copeland's Apothecary, Mesa Drug Store, Murphy & Phillips & JamesxPurcell.

Upon motion of Councilman Moslander, seconded by Councilman Meders permits were ordered granted to the above.

The following made application for licenses to operate rooming houses within the City: Bell Rooming House, Wm. Donnelly, Harry Shiota, Brighton Rooms, Oxford Hotel, Pearl Hoyt, Mrs. Wm. Streb, J.G. March & Ezra Hall.

Upon motion of Councilman Moslander, seconded by Councilman Meders licenses were ordered granted the above.

It was moved by Councilman Moslander, seconded by Councilman Meders that all bids for the construction of Combined Sewer District No. 4 be rejected and that the City Auditor advertise for new bids, the same to be opened February 17th 1926 at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M. or as soon thereafter as the matter could be taken up. Upon this motion all the Councilmen present voted YEA, and the President of the Council declared the motion carried and the Auditor so instructed.

Upon motion of Councilman Bear, seconded by Councilman Meders the City Manager was instructed to investigate the advisability of granting J.W. Watson lower rates on water used at his green houses on Orchard Mesa.
