

Grand Junction, Colorado

April 21 1926

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bell, Bear, Fairley & Logsden. City Manager Thompson, City Clerk Peck & City Attorney Hinman were absent.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and of the adjourned meeting of April 18th and 14th were read and approved.

Robt. Rhone appeared before the council informing them in regard to the contemplated bus line to be established between this City and Dotsero providing that the Public Utilities Company authorizes the same.

The report of J.E. Ragan, C.P.A covering the period May 4th 1925 to December 31 1925 was presented, upon motion of Councilman Bear, seconded by Councilman Logsden the report was accepted and filed.

H. Spencer made application to operate a rooming house to be known as the St. Charles Rooms, said house being located on So. 2nd St. The application was approved by the Chief of Police: Upon motion of Councilman Fairley seconded by Councilman Bear the application was ordered filed and a license granted.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the Council adjourned upon motion of Councilman Logsden, seconded by Councilman Fairley that the meeting adjourn.
