Grand Junction, Colorado

July 7th 1926.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bell, Bear, Ellison, Fairley, Logsden, Meders & Moslander. City Manager Thompson & City Clerk Peck were present. City Attorney Hinman was absent.

The minutes of the last regular session and of the special session held June 30 were read and approved.

A communication from the Chamber of Commerce endorsing the plan of the City Council to hire a city planner to zone the city and to make other plans in reference to future development of the town was read.

The Grand Junction Street Railway Co presented a letter stating that permission is being asked for them to remove certain street car tracks in the city, doing away with the city street car service. On motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Bear the communication was laid on the table for future consideration.

R.A. Ross, president of the Chamber of Commerce and several other members of the board were present also endorsing the plan of the City Council to hire a city planner to zone the city.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Moslander that the City Manager be authorized to employ a city planner to zone and make other plans for the future development of the City. The firm of City Planners to submit to the Council an outline of the proposed plan. Upon which motion all the Councilmen voted "YEA" and the President declared the motion carried.

Dr. Oyler a resident on North Seventh Street appeared before the Council asking the water and gas lines on said street between Teller and North be replaced before any paving is done. Dr. Oyler was assured that paving would not be placed on any street unless the water and other lines were in good condition.

The A & W Root Beer Store filed an application for a permit to dispense soft drinks. Upon motion of Councilman Moslander seconded by Councilman Logsden the permit was granted.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting adjourned upon motion of Councilman Logsden, seconded by Councilman Bear.
