

Grand Junction, Colo.

July 21 1926.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Ellison, Bear, Meders, Fairley & Logsden. City Attorney Hinman, City Manager Thompson and City Clerk Peck were present. Councilmen Bell & Moslander were absent.

Upon motion of Councilman Bear, seconded by Councilman Meders, Councilman Ellison was elected President pro-tem and he proceeded to take the chair.

A paving petition petitioning the paving of Chipeta Avenue from First Street to Seventh Street was presented, the same having been checked by the City Clerk and found to contain more than 33 1/2% of the frontage signed.

Councilman Meders moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the petition be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

The Continental Oil Company made application for a permit to erect a curb gasoline pump at 1025 N. 12th Street. Upon motion of Councilman Bear, seconded by Councilman Meders action on the same was deferred until the next regular meeting.

A communication from S.R. De Boer was read in regard to city planning.

Councilman Fairley moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the City Manager obtain the wishes of the residents of N. First Street from Grand Ave to Main st in the matter of the width of the proposed paving. Motion carried.

Attorney Tupper was present in the interest of the Western Slope Auto ways. He had nothing to present at this time.

On motion of Councilman Logsden, seconded by Councilman Bear the meeting adjourned.
