

Grand Junction Colorado.

August 11 1926.

All the Councilmen having been duly notified the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Ellison, Bear, Fairley, Logsdan, Meders, Moslander & Bell. City Manager Thompson, City Clerk Peck and City Attorney Hinman were present.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

A.A. Johnson made application for a rooming house license at 441 Pitkin. Upon motion of Councilman Logsdan, seconded by Councilman Bear the matter was referred to the City Manager for investigation with the power to grant said license.

Mrs. E. Riga made application for a permit to erect a gasolene pump at the curb at 809 South Seventh St. Upon motion of Councilman Logsdan, seconded by Councilman Bear the permit was granted.

The following applications were read for the position of City Auditor Rae Eastman, Forest Clem, C.P. Bliss, E.L. Mc Clure, Lee A George.

Councilman Moslander moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that the salary of the City Auditor be reduced from \$175.00 to \$150.00 per month and that an ordinance be drafted to comply with said motion. Motion carried.

A proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE SALARY OF THE CITY AUDITOR" was introduced and read. Upon motion of Councilman Moslander, seconded by Councilman Bear the proposed ordinance was passed for publication.

Councilman Logsdan moved, seconded by Councilman Bear that C.P. Bliss be appointed to the Office of City Auditor and Ex-Officio City Clerk. Upon which motion all the Councilmen voted "yea" and the President declared the motion carried.

Representatives from Geo. W. Vallery & Company, Sidlo, Simons, Day & Company and Benwell & Company were present to submit bids for the bonds to be issued by Paving Dist. No. 17.

Sealed Bids were filed with the City Clerk, the following bids being tabulated:

Councilman Moslander thereupon moved, seconded by Councilman Logsdon that the bid of Geo. W. Vallery & Company of \$983.78 for 4 3/4% bonds be accepted, subject however to the creation of the district. Upon which motion all the Councilmen voted "yea" and the President declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting the Council adjourned upon motion of Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Bear.
