Request was presented by C. B. Cook to erect a concrete building and board fence on lots at the corner of 12th street and Belford Ave. for the sale of automobile parts and accessories. On motion regularly made, seconded and carried the request was denied.

Written request was presented by DR. George H. Chiles that his name be taken off of the petition for paving Chipeta Ave. from first to seventh streets. On motion of Councilman Moslander, seconded by Councilman Bear, the request was ordered filed.

Mr. Frank Callahan appeared before the Council in person and requested that a carnival and street fair might be held on Main Street, under the auspices of the American Legion, during their convention in this city August 25 to 28, 1926. On motion of Councilman Bear, seconded by Councilman Meders, permission was granted to put on such a carnival and fair, provided it was put on by local merchants, all license fees to be collected by the American Legion.

On motion regularly made by Councilman Meders, seconded by Councilman Moslander, and carried, the City Clerk was authorized to advertise for bids for the paving of District No. 17.

On motion of Councilman Bear, seconded by Councilman Meders, there being no more business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned.
