Moved by Councilman Ellison and seconded by Councilman Bear, that said Estimate No. 5, work done on Paving District No. 15 be accepted and allowed and the City Clerk be authorized to draw warrants for \$22,687.26 on Paving District No. 15 funds, and \$8,035.79 on Intersection fund in payment of same. Vote was taken on roll call. All the Councilmen present voting yea, President of the Council Bell declared the motion carried.

Application having been made to erect a hamburger stand on the lot at the southeast corner of Main and Third Streets by G. G. McKague, it was moved by Councilman Ellison and seconded by

Councilman Bear that the application be rejected. All the Councilman present voting yea, President of the Council Bell declared the motion carried.

On motion regularly made, seconded and carried, the application of D. L. Cook to erect a frame building on Lots 16 and 17, Block 127, to be used for the sale of second-hand automobile parts, was taken up for action, whereupon it was moved by Councilman Meders and seconded by Councilman Moslander that the application be rejected. Vote being duly taken and all the Councilmen voting yea, President of the Council Bell declared the motion carried.

Moved by Councilman Ellison and seconded by Councilman Bear, that the City Manager instruct the Chief of Police to enforce all ordinances, whereupon it was moved by Councilman Meders and seconded by Councilman Moslander, as a substitute motion, that the City Manager have the Chief of Police assign a police officer to restrict the red light district, and permit no further additions thereto. Vote was taken on the substitute motion by roll call. Those voting yea were Councilmen Meders, Moslander, Logsdon. Those voting nay were Councilmen Bear, Fairley, Ellison, Bell. President of the Council Bell declared the substitute motion lost. Vote was then taken on the original motion on roll call. Those voting yea were Councilmen Ellison, Bear, Fairley and Bell. Those voting nay were Councilmen Meders, Moslander and Logsdon. President of the Council Bell declared the motion carried.

On motion of Councilman Moslander, seconded by Councilman Meders and duly carried, the Council adjourned.
