

Grand Junction, Colo.,

December 9th, 1926

All the Councilmen having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. with President Bell presiding. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Bear, Meders, Fairley, Ellison, Logsdon, Moslander, and Bell. City Manager Thompson, City Attorney Hinman, and City Clerk Niles.

Mr. Frank Hall, Mr. D. B. Wright, and Mr. Beman C. Fox were present as a Committee from the Chamber of Commerce to bring before the Council the proposition of building a combined City and County jail building. Mr. Eugene Groves of Denver, Colorado was also present and talked to the Council from an architectural standpoint. After much discussion and consideration it was decided to hold this matter over until the next meeting on December 15th.

The matter of the Junior College appropriation was brought up and discussed at length. Councilman Fairley moved, seconded by Councilman Meders that Mr. Hinman go to Denver and attend the advisory Board meeting to be held there on the 16th day of December, and that Mr. Thompson should also remain in Denver for this meeting. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Councilman Moslander moved, seconded by Councilman Meders that the meeting adjourn.
